The Budapest Centre for Mass Atrocity Prevention is seeking interns. All applicants are expected to have an interest and some knowledge in preventing mass atrocities and promoting human rights. All applicants are also expected to possess strong skills in reading and writing in English, as well as in using web-based meeting software and some experience in web-design. All applicants should be proactive and able to work both independently and remotely in a team.

Applicants can apply to one of two tracks: (1) the use of artificial intelligence (AI) in preventing atrocity, or (2) the Responsibility to Protect (R2P) and its critics. Track 1 on AI is a research position in which interns will help in the collecting and analyzing of data regarding countries' artificial intelligence capacity. Applicants to this track should have experience in conducting research activities. Track 2 on R2P is a creative position in which interns will help conduct interviews on the prospects of R2P and help produce the Centre's podcast series. Applicants to this track should have experience with recording software and production. Interns in either track will help regularly update the Centre's website, including the E-Youth Library and help conduct the Centre's outreach activities.

For each track, applicants must submit a CV, writing sample, personal statement on their interest in preventing atrocities and promoting human rights, and a one-page discussion of their experience conducting research (for Track 1), or using recording and production software, as well as web-design (Track2). The interviews will take place via Zoom between October 11 -14. The internship is planned to start November 1 and will last a minimum of three months. The line manager will be Gary Uzonyi, senior research fellow of the Budapest Centre.
